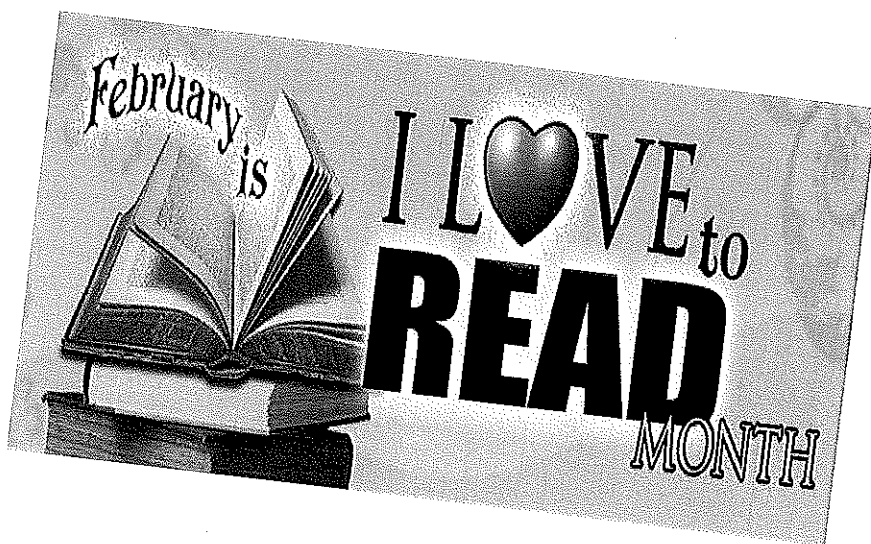


Good Luck to our RLG Raider Basketball teams and Coaches during March Madness. Thanks to all families and community members for your continual support.

KINDERGARTEN

Kindergarten

Our theme focus in January was "Winter Wonderland". Students learned about the four seasons, and how the season's temperatures affect the activities we do and how we dress. As part of our theme, we also learned all about penguins! In February our focuses is on friendship. We are learning what a friend is and how to be a great friend to our loved ones and peers.

In reading, students have been working hard at being independent readers. With February being "I Love to Read" month, kindergarteners have enjoyed having guest readers coming into our classroom. For the month, we are spotlighting an author each week to learn more about him or her. We have also dove into reading at home with book bags, continue to encourage your child to read independently at home!

In writing, students are doing well putting labels in in their descriptive pictures. In letterland students have learned letters a-s. We also have been working hard on learning letter sounds. Letterland continues to be a class favorite!

In Math we have been working on numbers, and more numbers! Students have been grouping numbers, continuing forwards and backwards, and writing numbers.

GRADE 1 & 2 CLASSROOM

MRS. PEDERSON:

The grade ones have written our newsletter with some support.

This is what they felt was important to let their parents and community members know what we are doing in the classroom.

The grade ones are learning lots of new things!

In CAFE we read the whole time, we stay in one spot, we read quietly, we get started right away, we ignore distractions and we are building our reading stamina. We are doing great! We are getting better at reading our books when Mrs. Pederson conferences with us.

We have fun when we write! We all have different goals to improve our writing. Some of our goals are putting periods at the end of sentences, finger spaces, using interesting words and blending and stretching our sounds. We have a wonderful time writing!

We have been studying plants and animals for science class. We researched jobs that people do with plants and animals. We experimented with watering and not watering plants to see what would happen. We like science. We can't wait until we're old enough to go to the science lab.

In math we are learning about numbers and adding and subtracting. We are making adding and subtracting stories using bugs and animals.

We practice stations to get better with numbers and other math skills. We had a guest math coach (Nicole Vinet) join us for a cookie problem with the grade 2s. Our brains grew because we worked so hard.

In gym class we have been practicing rolling and bouncing balls, jumping on one foot, hopping and static balancing with bean bags.

Sometimes we get to play games. We exercise to get stronger.

We have learned that we can sort feeling into zones. We have a green zone, a red zone, a blue zone and a yellow zone. The green zone means your happy and other feeling like that. The red zone means your out of control. The blue zone means your sad, tired or bored. The yellow zone means danger because you are feeling scared, confused, mad, worried or frustrated.

We have fun learning our zones!

A belated Happy New Year to you all! I can't believe how fast January has flown by and we're already in February!

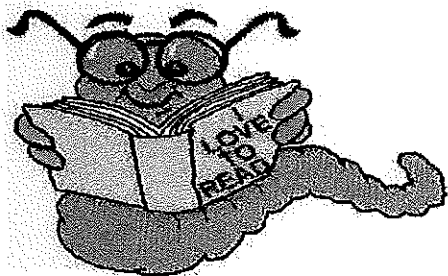
The students have been keeping very busy since returning from Christmas break. They've been hard at work in class completing projects and assignments in their various classes.

In **Language Arts** they continue to work hard with improving their reading levels, and some have shown significant growth! They continue to work on improving their spelling skills and they are working on producing good, quality written work through proper pre-planning before beginning the writing. Within the next couple of weeks, the students will begin to learn and practice cursive handwriting. My hope is by the end of June, most of their work is completed in handwriting versus printing!

Social Studies had the students wrap up their work on citizenship and being a good local, national, and global citizen. The students have really taken to the idea of being a good citizen, as many have started projects (all on their own) in which they are raising money for charities. Some students are selling art work, some are ~~selling hand-made jewelry, and others are~~

collecting pop can tabs. Posters about their fundraising efforts can be found scattered around the walls of the school. As we move into a new unit of study, they are now looking at Canada and its role in the world. Globes and maps will also be studied in this unit. The students have done a great number of season themed projects in **Art**, including making paper snowflakes, snowmen scenes casting shadows, a bird's-eye-view of a snowman, and thinking and writing about what it would be like if they lived in a snow globe! This month will have them working on various Valentine's projects as well as doing an artist study on famous Canadian artist Emily Carr. The Grade 4's have spent an ample amount of time in **Math** working with their multiplication and division facts. We are taking a break from this topic but will revisit it again in June. They are now working on their geometry unit in which they will be studying 2-D and 3-D shapes, along with exploring symmetry, slides, turns, and flips. This is always a fun unit! Challenge your child to answer basic multiplication or division questions while in the vehicle or over a meal, it will help them to hold onto the skills they have built up over the last couple of months.

I imagine February will fly by as fast as January did as there are a number of events and activities going on in relation to "I Love to Read" month.

Grade 5/6 Newsletter

Music

- We learned how to play "Smoke on the water" and "Can't get no satisfaction".
- We learned the strings on the guitar. In order they are, EADGBE.

English Language Arts

- We've been working on 'Character Stories'. Each person took turns drawing one part of our character (head, body, legs) and when we got our characters back, we had to write about their lives. Where they live, what their name is, if they have a family, what they eat, do they have a job, what their personality is.
- We've been writing Haiku's. They have 3 lines. Line one has 5 syllables, line 2 has 7 syllables, and line 3 has 5 syllables. There are 17 in total. Haiku's are about nature.
- We started with some I love to read month goals. We each decided on how many pages we want to read this month. Everyone's goal is different. If we each meet our goal, we will have a party.

French

- We are still learning about food.
- We are reading a story about Isabelle's adventures (Les aventures d'Isabelle). Isabelle is a very curious girl who likes to take pictures. She is helping a family that is poor.

Gym

- We did a unit on floor hockey and team handball.
- We have learned a lot about participating in teams.

Health

- We're learning how to take care of our bodies by eating healthy, and proper hygiene.
- We started learning about influenza; it is a really bad flu. There are only 4 types of influenza: Influenza A, B, C, and D.

Enrichment

- We were working on the Ross L Gray snow sculpture in front of the school.

Science

- We are learning about space. We found out there is water on Mars, Jupiter's Moon (Europa).
- We have watched many videos about space, about black holes, worm holes, and how a star is made and how it dies.
- We have also been reading space books.
- A student, who wishes not to be mentioned ;), presented her 4-H speech about the solar system.

Social Studies

- We are going to make power points about Canada's history; Women's lives, RCMP, farming, railroads, residential schools... etc.
- We have been learning important skills about research. We are learning to read and find the information we need.

Roots of Empathy

- Baby William now has teeth in the front. He is working on his back teeth. He can slide his body towards toys and his mom. He's making lots of sounds (mama, dada) He likes lullabies and when people sing to him. He is interested when people clap/move their hands.

- We've been watching videos about 'Math Antics' (Dog with a blog). These videos are about how to use decimals.
- We also go on Mathletics.



MR. FRIESEN'S CLASSROOM

Grade 7/8 ELA

The Grade 7/8 Class has been working on various types of non-fiction writing since the Christmas break. They have had the opportunity to re-tell events from their lives and write instructions to complete a task they understand. They will continue on improving the organization of their ideas in preparation for their persuasive essay.

Grade 7/8 Science

The Science class has just completed their mid-term exam and have learned and been exposed to some of the skills and study techniques in order to be prepared and be as successful as possible. We are now beginning to delve into the history of the Earth and the processes which have shaped out land to its present conditions.

Grade 7 Math

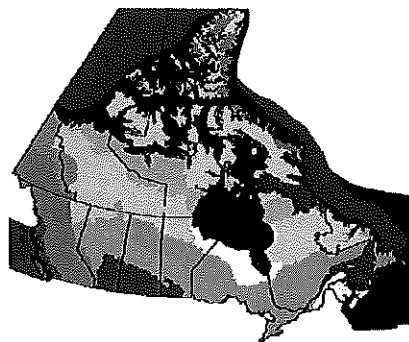
The Grade 7 Math class has completed their mid-term exam and have now began their exploration of patterns and relations between numbers in the form of linear mathematics and equations.

Grade 11/12 Biology

The biology class has started the 2nd semester by looking at the circulatory system of the human body. They will explore how the heart functions and how our body regulates those cardiac functions and blood chemistry. They will then connect that knowledge to the respiratory system and the symbiotic relationships necessary between the two systems.

Grade 9/10 Geography

The geography class will shortly conclude their study of different regions in Canada with a look at Eco zones that take into account all the previous characteristics they have studied. They will then have an opportunity to look at land use patterns in Canada and various types of industries that make use of the natural resources available from the land.



MR. STRADESKI'S REPORT

Most of my classes have recently completed their Midterm for the grade 9's and 10's or Final exams for the grade 11's. The **Grade 10 Pre-Calc. Math Class** is learning the basics of functions and relations. The **Grade 10 Essential Math Class** has just completed a unit on measurement and has moved into how they receive their pay for various types of jobs. The **Grade 12 Pre-Calc. Math Class** is just completing a unit on translations of general functions and will use this to translate specific functions moving forward.

The **Grade 12 Essential Math Class** has finished a unit on statistics and are now working on probability. They will be working on a small project where they will learn how to gamble, or more importantly, how not to gamble.

The **Grade 9 & 10 Science Class** has completed their unit on electricity and now are looking at space. We will be talking about how the Earth moves in our Solar System and how small we are compared to the rest of our Universe.

The **Grade 12 Chemistry** is new this semester. We started with a unit on spectroscopy and orbital where we discovered what kind of light is emitted when a compound is set on fire. We will be working on rates of reactions where we will study how fast a chemical reaction occurs. The **Grade 8 Math classes** is just completing a unit on integers and then they will be preparing for their second mid-term exam, just in time for parent-teacher interviews.

Finally, the Varsity Boys Basketball league play has just finished. For the third straight year we managed to get through our League undefeated and we can get the League Trophy for another year. We are now ready to play the Zone Finals game in Sprague on February 24th against

Pinawa at noon (followed by the Girls at 1:45). Then we will move on to the Regional Finals on March 4th. If all goes well, we will be heading to Provincials in Gladstone on March 16th to 18th. After two Finals defeats, I am looking for the boys to bring back that trophy.

MR. KEFFER'S REPORT

9/10 ELA students are currently working on tourism videos for our media awareness unit. Highlights include Brodie and Sebastien's stop motion clay figure video.

Music students are learning the basics of playing guitar starting with single string riffs for beginners.

In 3/4 computers we are working on a power point project called "My favorite Animal" where we use internet sources to explore habitat, food sources, adaptations, etc...

3 Math students are learning to sort objects by attribute using charts, graphs, and venn diagrams.

IA students are beginning a new semester with drafting and CNC design. Grade 10s must use their problem solving skills to produce a digital design for a finger jointed cube.

MR. BROWN'S REPORT

Is the school year half empty or half full?

The Grade 12 basketball players are at the point in their high school careers where they are saying, "tonight is our last regular season home game" and "next Monday is our last ever league game." Luckily for Raider fans we are hosting Zones on Feb. 24th and likely Regionals on March 4th. So there are still many opportunities to see the players that have brought so much pride and success to our program. The 7 grade 12 students have combined to win a total of 5 Provincial titles over the last 3 years and both teams are hoping to add more.

Once basketball season is over, the **Grade 10/11 Travel Club** will be making the journey to Italy and Greece for an epic odyssey. When they return, the Grade 11/12 class will go into full rehearsal mode for the Drama Club presentation on May 5th and 6th (mark your calendars now). So it appears that the school year is half full as Grade 12 students face choices, make plans and change their minds as new opportunities arise. Stress and anxiety will be high for these students as they face so much uncertainty. So give a random hug or some encouragement to these young adults, maybe share some of your wisdom in life, it can be a complicated journey. **The Grade 6-8 Junior Girls Basketball team** has had a great season so far. The 13 girls are playing in the Steinbach (Hanover) League again this year at the grade 8 level and they are off to a 5-0 start. Every game has been a close battle and the girls have pulled together to play strong team defense. Hard work, conditioning and relying on each other is a great recipe for success.

As **the young grade 6 players** find confidence on the basketball court, it is great to see them apply the same work ethic in the classroom as they build their Math skills. Hard work, conditioning and relying on each other transfers to the classroom as well. When you work hard and learn from mistakes, your confidence grows.

MR. ST. GODARD'S WINTER REPORT

Grade 3/4 Science:

We are nearing the end of our unit on forces that attract and repel on this planet and beyond. Students have been fascinated by the power of magnets, static electricity, air resistance, and currently, gravity. Students have been exploring and learning through hands on tasks and educational videos, including everyone's favorite, Bill Nye the Science Guy. Upon completion of this unit, we will move into plants and soils in environment. Just in time for spring.

K – 3 Physical Education:

Much has been done these past few months. Students have been practicing their balancing ~~skills and are able to perform both a static and~~

dynamic balance in a variety of ways. We have also spent time mastering underhand throwing and catching. Finally, we transitioned from the underhand throw to rolling which we are still practicing today. Aside from the basic movement skills, students have found themselves playing a variety of different low organized games and even getting outside for snowshoeing and to the rink to skate and toboggan.

4 – 8 Physical Education:

Team sports have been stressed lately. We spent time prior to Christmas on team handball and following the break we went straight into floor hockey. Work as a member of a team and being a respectful athlete was the main focus. Just like the younger students at school, the 4-8's also enjoyed a splash of winter as we went snowshoeing and spent time at the rink playing broom ball and tobogganing. Currently, the students are learning pickle ball. The buzz in the halls is "were playing pickle ball today." "Does it involve a pickle?" The sport is much like tennis and the students are beginning to grasp the strategies and enjoying themselves.

9 – 12 Physical Education:

Health has been a big part of our physical education and health class lately. The 9/10 students are working on substance use and abuse and the grade 11/12's will begin a health module focused on mental health in the near future. The past few months, our high school students have also been partaking in much of the activities as the rest of the school. This includes the winter outdoor activities such as snowshoeing, skating and tobogganing. We have also been working hard to understand the rules and strategies of pickle ball. With basketball soon to come to an end, badminton season will follow. I am looking for students in the high school interested in continuing to represent Ross L. Gray school as a single or mixed doubles player.

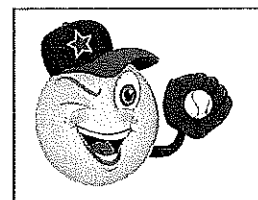

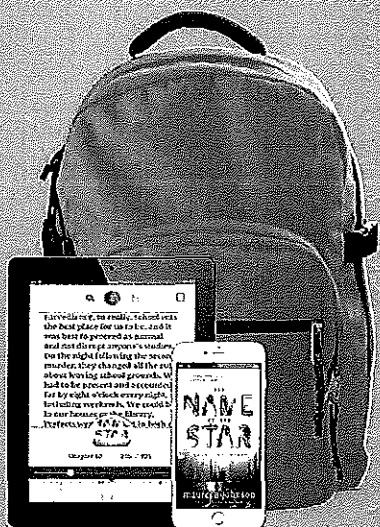

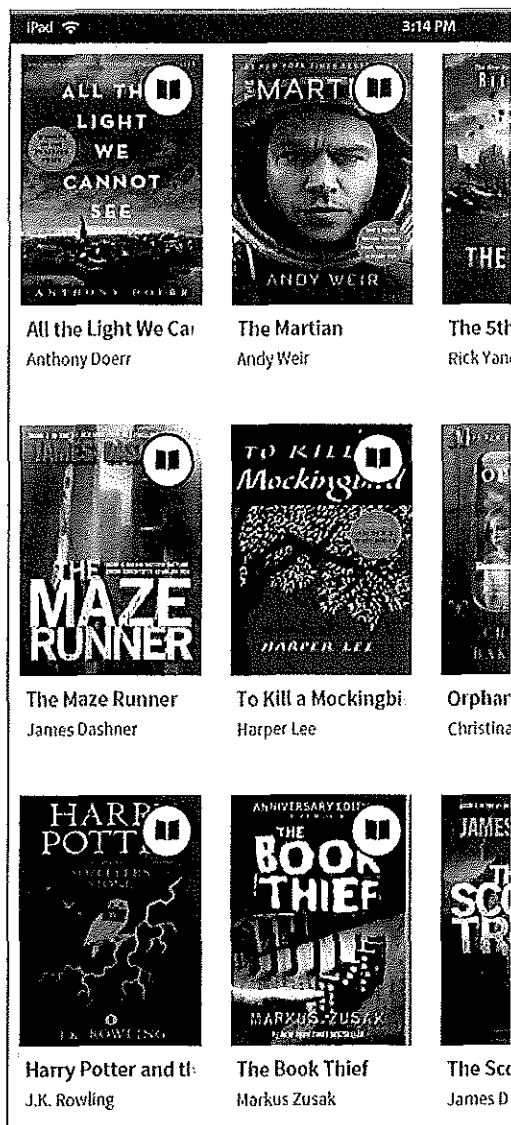
